How we promote the fundamental British values

Individual liberty – what do we do?

1. Support pupils to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence
 - Pupil questionnaires
 - IM assessments
 - Transition work with new teacher
 - PSHE
 - IM sessions
2. Encourage pupils to take responsibility for their behaviour
 - Setting class IM targets
 - Setting personal targets
 - WOW forms
 - restorative discussions post incident
3. Develop pupils' understanding of the balance between individual rights and their responsibility to themselves and others
 - Roles, rights and responsibilities learnt about and discussed in phase and whole school assemblies
 - PSHE lessons
 - Visits and workshops (community policing team and /crucial crew)
4. Model freedom of speech through pupil participation whilst ensuring protection of the vulnerable
 - Embedded into the ethos of lessons and interaction between pupils and pupils and staff
5. Maintain a strong anti-bullying culture
 - All classes engage in activities during anti-bullying week
 - Views of pupils taken into account when developing whole school systems and policies
 - All pupils and staff work collaboratively to develop a zero tolerance approach to bullying
 - Assemblies, class discussion and PSHE lessons spent ensuring all pupils know what bullying is and isn't. Pupils taught who to talk to and what to do if they feel they are worried.

- As appropriate to age and stage pupils are taught about Cyber/Online bullying. Lessons are embedded in our Computing curriculum – what it is and what to do if they have any worries.
